2025 was another busy year for Moms for Liberty - King County! It was a fabulous group effort to improve education, support parental rights and protect girls' sports. Below are just a few of the actions taken by members of the board and individual members. Some were group efforts as part of our chapter and others were efforts by members and citizens inspired by the fight for parental rights and the support our chapter provided. In addition to the actions listed, there are a number that we do "under the radar."

### **Participated in Washington State Legislative Committee**

- Reviewed more than 110 submitted bills related to education, parental rights and protecting girls' sports.
- Helped develop 2025 Legislative Agenda.
- Encouraged comments from citizens.
- Provided written testimony for multiple bills.
- 2025 Day in Olympia - met with individual legislators and received rousing standing ovation from Conservative Caucus.
- Provided white papers on issues related to education, parental rights and girls' sports.
- Delivered hand written thank you notes to Republican legislators who support parental rights.
- Created the first legislative score card for parental rights.

### **Attended conferences and training**

- Chapter Chair attended Moms for Liberty training Boot Camp at Patriot Academy in Texas.
- Three board members attended Moms for Liberty National Summit in Florida.
- Participated in outstanding online events through M4L Academy.

### **Supported Initiatives IL26-001, *strengthen communication between parents and schools* and IL26-658 *protecting fairness in girls' sports***

- Members participated in collection of thousands of signatures.
- Chapter Chair spoke at multiple Super Signer Rallies.
- Board members attended the turn-in event in Tumwater.

### **Secured legal counsel for lawsuit against Seattle Public Schools opt out policy and scouring population for plaintiffs.**

### **Took first action steps in DOGE-ed project to identify waste and abuse of taxpayer dollars in school districts**

- Start up meetings and communications between interested members.
- Submitted public records requests.
- Work with various individuals to make funding process accurate and transparent.

### **Supported Common Sense School Board Candidates**

- Inspired candidates to run.
- Provided information specific to campaigns and education in WA State.
- Consulted and communicated helpful information via email and online meetings.
- Boots on the Ground: delivered flyers, waved signs etc.
